## President Report – April 22 2026

**The Club is in a great spot at the moment, and I'm optimistic about the future of the club. I'll let Chris Tenni, and Danny speak more specifically around Juniors in a moment.**

**On the Senior side of the club we have a great numbers at the moment, with 93 registered players this Year across 5 teams.**

**Included in those numbers were our first 3 female Senior players in the clubs history, Marley Tropiano - Hayley Williams and Hannah Boiland, which I'm extremely proud of.**

**And on field we had success as well with 3 of our 5 teams making finals, with a Minor premiership for 3's and an awesome come from behind GF Flag for our 2's who looked to be out of contention for finals with a few games to go. While the A grade season wasn't as successful as we would have liked, we can take away an idea now of the level that is required to play in the top grade.**

**We were finally recognised by WA cricket, winning the Diversity and Inclusion award after many years being nominated. Which is on the back of the hard work put in by Helen, Danny and all the other ICL**

**volunteers. As well as the efforts put in by Rob, Chris and the rest of the committee in promoting our female cricket program.**

**I was particularly proud seeing so many Senior players turn up to support the Junior Girls team win their flag this season. And I think that everyone of the guys there would say they were impressed by the level of cricket on display. Having so much support from Seniors proof of our efforts at growing our female cricket program and more importantly, integrating them into the club as a whole. We made a change to ensure that the oldest age groups of girls are playing their games at windermere and having an opportunity to use the facilities available at our top ground. We also put great effort into bringing the girls into Senior cricket, as well as the Junior v Senior match. Both giving an opportunity for the girls to play along side the boys and for the guys to get an understanding of the quality of cricketing talent that our girls have.**

**From a personal perspective, I enjoyed this season of cricket more than any I've played before. Watching our younger players grow in confidence getting their first experiences playing Senior cricket, and getting better and better throughout the year has been fantastic. And Neil has done an amazing job as captain creating a supportive culture that plays competitive**

**cricket that doesn't come at the cost of sportsmanship, setting an example for the players of what I believe should be the JKCC of playing cricket. Tough, fair and respectful competitors, that support each other. Having the Marley, Hayley and Hannah play in the side was also a highlight. It must have been intimidating for them to enter a Men's competition, but their enthusiasm and attitude was great. And they weren't shy to go looking for any opportunity to improve their skills. Their performances showed they well and truly were talented enough to compete in the Men's competition. The response from every club we played against was fantastic, with all the teams being complementary of us integrating the girls into the side, and I believe it lead to both teams enjoying the games more. I think partly that may come from a lot of us guys in the bottom grades of cricket, sometimes pretending that we don't love cricket etc With many of our Junior female players now reaching the age of eligibility for Senior Women's cricket, I'm hopeful that we'll be able to get a Senior Women's team on the park next season, and I will be doing everything I can to support this to happen.**

**As well as the many other volunteers that have helped out across ICL and Juniors. The time that you all dedicated to volunteering, many of you with bigger issues that needed your attention behind the scenes is massive. Everyone looked out for each other and helped out if people needed time away. I appreciate all the support and time you've given me and the club. Thank you. I'd also like to congratulate this years winner of the Kieth Kreibitch Award : Ros Spawton, who looked after merchandise and worked the bar every blasters & ICL friday night even while going through chemotherapy. I can't think of anyone else who deserves it more. Congratulations to Ros. To give a quick update on the lease, council have realised they need to build storage for the scoreboards of both clubs, and this has delayed the**

changeover from our lease, to the hire by usage model. They currently have no timeline for the change, but I would estimate that based on the process required to upgrade the facilities likely taking a while, we won't see a change in the near future. When I came onboard as President 2 years ago, there was a few members that spoke to me with concerns about the lack of information and transparency around the financial situation of the club. The lack of detail in the reporting at the AGM had raised concerns. At that point there had been no reconciliation of expenses for 3 years previously, and there was no processes in place to keep receipts. We contacted a book keeper, who went through the previous years to bring the books up to date as best as possible. Rob when he came on board halfway through the season and developed processes to make keeping receipts and records easy. There was more pushback and resistance to implementing these changes that I had expected. Coming into this season, we had no real understanding of the true cost of running the club for a season , as previously the expenses weren't being tracked well enough to accurately budget. We implemented some processes to ensure that regular stocktakes were being done, and the app next we introduced at the end of the previous season to streamline the process of

**uploading receipts ensured that we were able to reconcile all purchases.**

**This season we also eliminated cash sales, as we had lost over \$1000 in just the last 3 months of the season - prior to that there was no reconciliation being done of the cash in till to reported cash sales. the changes we have made have stopped a lot of money leaking out of the club. Despite spending \$5500 less on stocking the canteen - soft drinks, chips, as well as bread rolls and sausages for sausage sizzles etc, we still made the same amount of money in sales for as last year. And more significantly, the changes implemented after the huge loss of alcohol last season, meant that we spent \$4000 less on alcohol and made an extra \$3000 in sales. Eliminating cash sales was a significant factor. While we still lost some alcohol, we identified the loss at the start of the season, and took action to limit access to the alcohol fridge, there was no further losses until the end of the season. Eliminating cash sales was a significant factor.**

**My recommendation would be that moving forward, the club should keep the bookkeeper on board and at a minimum have her do a check halfway through the season to ensure that the financials are being kept up to date. This way if there are issues they can be**

addressed and fixed prior to the end of the year, and continue to have her audit and provide financial reports for the AGM as an independent 3rd party. Given this significant turnover of the club \$150k - \$180k think the club should consider paying the bookkeeper to fully manage the reconciliation of the accounts, and the treasurer role can be more focused on approving purchases and ensuring invoices and receipts are being passed on to the bookkeeper - this will prevent the yoyo-ing the clubs finances have had when the skill levels and time commitments of treasurers change from season to season. I won't be nominating for president next season. I'm honoured to have been trusted by the members to hold this position for the last 2 years. I'm most proud of the good governance changes that we have introduced, to ensure there are checks and balances and transparent financial reporting. I'm especially proud of the integration and support of the female cricket program, and the culture that the club has been growing these past 2 years. I've always made an effort to keep the future success of the club in mind with any decisions I've made whilst in this position. I can honestly say that this has been the most difficult job I've ever had, and has caused me more stress and more lost sleep than any real job I've had in the past. It has also taught me a great deal, and I've appreciated the experience that it has given me. I

**think its important to remember that volunteering in these roles do not give us “ownership” of the club in any way, we are trusted to be custodians of the club but we are not owed anything from the club because we have taken a role on the executive or general committees.**

**Lastly, I’d like to thank my Partner Sharne, she can’t be here tonight as she is at home looking after our 2 week old daughter. I appreciate all her support and patience with the late night committee meetings, distracting group chats and emails and phone calls. On top of dealing with a significant other who is out of the house at least 2 nights a week as well as half a weekend playing cricket.**

## Off Field Reflections:

- JKCC Juniors Y4-12 brought in approx. 66% of PlayHQ fee revenue for the season. Fees possibly a little too high given unknown with venue hire cost increases.
- Parent Volunteers scarce and hard to find
- Senior Involvement has been pleasing and has assisted the smooth running of the club.
- Junior/Senior/ICL connections very strong, club working effectively. ICL Friday nights enabling Blasters to run with canteen/bar assistance, great support.

## Financial:

- Fortunate position to have large numbers, large revenue, paid early in the season with predictable repeat season costs. Pre-ordered balls, next seasons balls in stock.
- We haven't fully replenished the ball stocks to last years numbers nor marquee purchases so we anticipate some costs there but expenditure roughly captures a typical juniors season.

## Ovals:

- At capacity, WA Cricket undertaking fixturing, limited use of non-standard ovals. Looking to use Primary Schools in the future if growth continues, at capacity, one new team will require a reshuffle.
- We have lost access to Santiago to Little Athletics on Saturdays and through non-use.

## Facilities:

- Need to look into adding a net or two at Falklands, Accessing nets at Bramston.
