## STAGE 1 - Years 4 and 5 Boys, Year 4/5 Girls.

Captains (c) and Vice Captains (vc) are selected on a rotating basis throughout the season by the Coach. Managers are to keep a record of who was captain on which round of the season.

Captains are responsible for setting the standards on-field to the team under the code of behaviour from the CJCC on players.

## STAGE 2 - Years 6 and 7 Boys, Year 6/7 Girls.

Captains (c) and Vice Captains (vc) can be selected at the start of the season by the Coach. Captains can also be selected on a game-to-game rotation as determined by the coach at the start of the season.

Coaches could choose to use the 3.2.1 system. Three being the first selection. The player with the most votes is the captain, second most votes the VC. In the case of a draw the Coach and or coaches will have the deciding vote. However, the Coach has the discretion on how to select the captain in these age groups.

Captains are responsible for setting the standards on-field to the team under the code of behaviour from the CJCC on players. Captains will be responsible for setting the fields with the guidance from the coach. Captains will also be responsible for making sure the bowlers rotate as per each week's rotation schedule, already set out by the coach.

There should be as little support on field from the coach as possible, to encourage the teams to work together to get the fields right. Coaching of tactics on-field should be done at the breaks collectively as a group. This will encourage the players to think their way through cricket situations as they occur on the field. At this age level it is best to speak to the opposition before the game to set out some clear guidelines as to field setting by coaches during play.

## STAGE 3 - Years 8, 9 and 10/11 Boys, Year 8/9 Girls.

Captains (c) and Vice Captains (vc) are selected at the start of the season by the team under the guidance of the Coach. This will be done with a 3.2.1. system. Three being the first selection. The player with the most votes is the captain, second most votes the VC. In the case of a draw the Coach and or coaches will have the deciding vote.

If a Coach feels the selection is not appropriate it is at their discretion how this is handled. It is recommended that the Coach involves the Coaching Coordinator for advice.

Captains are responsible for setting the standards on the field to the team under the code of behaviour from the CJCC on players. Captains should understand the Laws of Cricket from the MCC. Captains will be responsible for setting the fields. Captains will also be responsible for making sure
the bowlers rotate as per each week's rotation schedule and for making on field decisions about any tactics around changing those rotations. Captains will be responsible for the off-field behaviour of the team.

There should be very little support on field from the coach, to encourage the teams to work together to get the match day tactics right. Coaching of tactics on-field should be done at the breaks collectively as a group. This will encourage the players to think their way through cricket situations as they occur on-field. At this age level there should be no-field coaching from the coach.
